About two years earlier, I played Steve in the Berkeley Repertory Theatre production of Fugard's A Lesson From Aloes. My career at OSF has included many Shakespeare roles and number of roles in productions of August Wilson's important works. Next season I will be back at OSF doing the role of Holloway in Two Trains Running. The works of Wilson and Fugard have kept many of us black actors on stage. So whenever I get the chance to speak the worlds they have written, I feel a true sense of honor and history."

EMILY GREGORY (STAGE MANAGER)

Emily originally hails from the San Francisco Bay Area, but she has called Portland home since graduating from Lewis & Clark College in 2010. PAT PATTON (DIRECTOR)

In Portland he has directed Blue/Orange. Inspecting Carol and Ah, Wilderness and played Jim the Gardener in Humble Boy and Shamrayev in The Seagull for Artists' Repertory Theatre and A Steady Rain by Keith Huff for Hellfire Productions. For Profile Theatre Pat has directed At Home at the Zoo, Thief River, Biloxi Blues and The Young Man from Atlanta, and staged readings of The Odd Couple, Valentine's Day, Dividing the Estate and A Walk in the Woods.
