# FESTIVAL OF ONE ACTS By Sam Shepard

9 Short Plays & Stories | 6 Actors | 6 Directors | 6 Bands | 8 Performances

September 3 – 8, 2014

PORTLAND, Ore., August 11, 2014 – **PROFILE THEATRE (Adriana Baer, Artistic Director)** proudly presents **Festival of One Acts by** Sam Shepard. Performances run September 3-8, 2014 on the Morrison Stage at Artists Repertory Theatre. Tickets are currently on sale at Profiletheatre.org.

Six directors tackle nine of Sam Shepard's vast and varied short plays and memoirs. With live music by a different band each night, this festival is a celebration not to be missed! Presented in two series, Series A and Series B, catch all nine plays over two nights or come to our marathon weekend performances and see all nine in one day!

"Sam Shepard's short plays and stories give us a look inside the mind of a writer who can't seem to stop writing," says **Artistic Director Adriana Baer.** "These plays, rarely, if ever, performed make up a cross-section of Shepard's writing life. From *Cowboys #2* (1967) to *Evanescence, or Shakespeare in the Alley* (2011), we hear beautiful and haunting images and recognize obsessions that stretch across five decades. These pieces were chosen because they show the depth and breadth of this writer, a truly singular voice in the American theatre."

# Festival of One Acts

**Festival of One Acts** is comprised of nine short works that are split into two separate performances, Series A and Series B that can be purchased separately or in weekend marathon packages. Series A consists of *The War in Heaven, The Curse of the Raven's Black Feather, Hail from Nowhere, Just Space, Rhythm* and *Evanescence, or Shakespeare in the Alley.* Series B is *Savage/Love* by Sam Shepard and *Joseph Chaikin, Tongues* and *Cowboys #2*.

In order to create a lively and eclectic environment for this quirky and varied collection of short works, each performance is preceded by live music performances in the Artists Rep lobby with post-show discussions, beer tastings and food carts on marathon weekends. # About Sam Shepard

Sam Shepard was born in 1943 in Fort Sheridan, Illinois. He worked as a farmhand and musician before moving to New York to begin his career as a playwright. His first productions, one-acts *Cowboys* and *The Rock Garden*, were performed at St. Mark's Church-in-the-Bowery. His first full-length play, *La Turista*, was performed at the American Place Theatre and won an Obie Award in 1967. Mr. Shepard spent several seasons with La MaMa and Caffe Cino in New York and as playwright-in-residence at the Magic Theatre in San Francisco. In 1979, he was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for Drama for *Buried Child*. His screenplay for *Paris, Texas* won the Golden Palm Award at the 1984 Cannes Film Festival. In 1986, he was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and in 1992 he received their Gold Medal for Drama. Mr. Shepard is also a director and film actor.
